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BEFORE THE CONVENTIONS: THE PRESIDENTIAL RACE
August 15-19, 2008

It's summertime. Before the party conventions, and before the naming of vice presidential running mates, the contest for the presidency is close, with many voters still waiting to make up their minds - or to commit firmly to a choice.

Each of the candidates has strengths and weaknesses: McCain scores on qualities related to experience and he is somewhat less likely to be seen as pandering to his audience; but Obama is more empathetic and is viewed as running a more positive campaign. One possible explanation for the relatively large undecided and uncommitted numbers is that -- even after what has been a long campaign -- majorities of voters don't think either candidate has made it clear what he would do if elected President.

Right now, Democrat Barack Obama has the support of 45% of registered voters, with John McCain the choice of 42%. Like the CBS News Poll completed earlier this month, each candidate is the choice of more than three in four of his own partisans, with independents now clearly favoring McCain.

Asking undecided voters which candidate they lean towards does not change the results. And about one in four of each candidate's supporters admit their minds could still change.

There is only a small undercurrent of negative voting, mostly from McCain supporters. As has been the case all summer, Obama's supporters are much more enthusiastic. In this poll, twice as many Obama voters as McCain voters are enthusiastic about their choice. About one in four McCain supporters admit they are voting for him only because he is the Republican nominee or that their vote is a vote AGAINST Obama. That's twice the percentage of Obama supporters who give either of those reasons for their support of him.

INSIDE THE HORSE RACE

Earlier in the month independents were divided between the two candidates, but they are now leaning towards McCain. 48% of independents support McCain, as opposed to 36% for Obama.

While Obama continues to hold a lead among women overall, he has lost the edge he held recently among men. McCain now leads slightly among men overall, and this is driven by a surge of support over the last month among white men. 54% of white men now support McCain, up from 45% at the beginning of the month.

McCain is again leading among working class whites - those making under \$50,000 a year with less than a college education. While earlier this month he was leading among less educated whites, he is now leading among lower income whites as well.

- Obama leads McCain among Democrats, liberals and moderates, African Americans, voters under age 45, and women.

Most Clinton supporters from the primaries are backing Obama, and this is true of both men and women who supported Clinton in the primaries. Half of the women who have not put their support behind Obama are undecided, while half are supporting McCain.

- McCain leads among Republicans and independents, conservatives, and voters age 45 and over. McCain leads among whites overall (both men and women), among white evangelicals, and working class whites.

About half of all voters - 51% - say they have been paying a lot of attention to the campaign this year, but that doesn't mean that they are paying a lot of attention NOW. Only about a third - 36% - admit they have been paying a lot of attention in the last few weeks. This lessened recent attention is shared by both Republicans and Democrats, by Obama supporters and McCain voters.

STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES

According to the voters, John McCain has the stronger resume by far. Two in three say he has prepared himself well enough for the job - something fewer than half of voters say about Obama. Twice as many voters say it is very likely McCain will be an effective Commander-in-Chief than say that about Obama. And McCain has a small lead on voter confidence that he will make the right decisions on foreign policy.

But McCain has a disadvantage here too. Perhaps because of his support for the Bush Administration's policy in Iraq, or the perception by 47% -- nearly half -- of voters that McCain will continue Administration policies in general, it is Obama who has the edge in perceptions of economic decision-making ability, which has been voters' biggest concern this year.

In addition, voters are twice as likely to say that Obama will improve the United States' image abroad as to say McCain will.

Obama has advantages with voters when it comes to empathy - as have Democratic candidates historically. Voters are more likely to say he cares about their needs and problems. They also think he may be more like themselves - someone they could relate to.

More see Obama as having strong religious beliefs, although neither candidate is seen that way by a majority of voters. Voters are more likely to have a favorable view of Obama, though not by much. However, majorities agree that both Obama and McCain share the values most Americans try to live by.

Even their campaigns are viewed differently. A majority say McCain is spending more time attacking Obama than explaining what he would do as president. Obama, by better than two to one, is viewed as running a positive campaign.

Race has not come into the campaign, most voters say. But about a third says it has. 8% say McCain has brought up the issue of race unfairly in the campaign, 12% say that about Obama. 11% say they both have.

But there is an Obama campaign weakness, too. 51% say he more often says what he thinks people want to hear than what he really believes. McCain has a better image on saying what he believes - although the margin is very narrow.

Voters have these differences at the top of their minds. When asked - regardless of how they intended to vote -- to name something they liked about McCain, experience was at the top of the list, mentioned

by 14%. That was followed by his military service (13%), integrity (7%), and being, as he has frequently claimed, a "straight talker" (4%).

As for Obama, what voters say they like about him are that he'll bring change (10%), is inspirational (9%), is a good speaker and a fresh face (7% each), integrity (5%) and is young and intelligent (4% each).

But - 21% of voters offered that they liked "nothing" about each of the presumptive nominees.

And there is the big unknown. Even after months of campaigning, voters are unsure about what either of these candidates will do as president.

And one poll result suggests that voters think this is the candidates' fault. When asked if the candidates have given the issue the voter cares most about enough of a priority, 61% say "no!"

This poll was conducted among a random sample of 1,012 adults nationwide, including 869 registered voters, interviewed by telephone August 15-19, 2008. Phone numbers were dialed from RDD samples of both standard land-lines and cell phones. The error due to sampling for results based on the entire sample and for registered voters could be plus or minus three percentage points. The error for subgroups is higher.
