MO GOP wants Talent for Sen., Huck and Palin for pres.

Raleigh, N.C. – Former Senator Jim Talent was narrowly defeated by Claire McCaskill in 2006, and his party's voters overwhelmingly prefer that he take McCaskill on again than go with someone new. The race for President is much closer, with adjacent Arkansas' Mike Huckabee barely topping Sarah Palin.

Talent is preferred by 53% when pitted against announced candidate Sarah Steelman, who gets 17%, and Peter Kinder, who has half of Talent's support, at 26%. Only 4% are not sure. Last Wednesday's release showed both Talent and Kinder leading McCaskill by two points and the incumbent beating Steelman by one, in what should be yet another in a string of very evenly matched races for this seat.

62% of her own party's most fervent voters still have no expressed opinion of Steelman, the former state treasurer, nor do 57% know enough about Lieutenant Governor Kinder, so both have plenty of time in about a year and a half to raise their profiles. Those who have heard of the two are overwhelmingly positive, 34-9 for Kinder and 25-13 for Steelman.

The general election for president may not be quite as close, depending on the nominee, but the early race for the chance at the nomination is. Huckabee gets 27% to Palin's 25%, a statistical tie, with the race for third place also close—Newt Gingrich at 15% and Mitt Romney at 14%. As usual, Ron Paul, Tim Pawlenty, John Thune, and Mitch Daniels receive minimal support in a battle of name recognition.

"Sarah Steelman has a lot of work to do with Republican voters over the next year and a half but this initial low level of support shouldn't be too much of a concern for her," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "If there's one thing we saw over and over this year it was that the numbers in primary contests can move awfully quick."

PPP surveyed 400 usual Missouri Republican primary voters from November 29^{th} to December 1^{st} . The survey's margin of error is +/-4.9%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
