Kissell in good shape

Raleigh, N.C. – Although there is some level of unhappiness with Larry Kissell among Democratic primary voters, a primary challenge against him appears it would be an up hill battle.

Just 29% of Democrats in the district generally say they would support a more progressive alternative to Kissell while 42% say they would not and 29% are unsure. Tested specifically against 2002 nominee Chris Kouri, who some are courting to challenge Kissell, the incumbent leads 49-15.

Challenging the conventional wisdom it is actually conservative Democrats who are most unhappy with Kissell, giving him just a 46% approval rating. With moderates he's at 63% and with liberals he stands at 57%.

There are more than twice as many voters (27%) in the district who think that Congressional Democrats are too liberal as there are (12%) who think they're too conservative. While liberals unhappy with Kissell have gotten more attention they are actually a distinct minority.

"This is a classic case of why we do scientific surveys," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "There's a perception based on anecdotes that Kissell is facing an uprising from the left when the more conservative voters in his party are actually unhappier. The loudest voices frequently are not the most numerous."

PPP will release numbers tomorrow looking at how Bev Perdue and Richard Burr are faring in NC-8, which is often a bellwether for North Carolina politics.

PPP surveyed 393 NC-8 Democratic primary voters from January 9^{th} to 11th. The margin of error is +/-4.9%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
