


Figure 1: Obama Approval – All Adults






Figure 2: Obama Approval - Registered Voters




Figure 3: Congress Approval – All Adults






Figure 4: Congress Approval - Registered Voters




Figure 5: 2010 Congressional Vote - All Adults






Figure 6: 2010 Congressional Vote - Registered Voters




Figure 7: Direction of Country - All Adults






Figure 8: Direction of Country - Registered Voters
